Dr. Goyal Will Provide Laparoscopic

Services and Training



Dr. Sunita Goyal, Professor and Head of the Obstetrics and Gynaecology Department at Ludhiana CMC, wasn't herself a student of Dr. Beryl Howie. She was part of the Batch of 79, and Dr. Howie left Ludhiana in 1981, when she was a second year student. But they did meet, and of course she knew her by reputation. Dr. Howie was behind the construction in 1982 of the whole block which houses the

OB/GYN department, and it bears her name today. So it is with personal as well as professional satisfaction that Dr. Goyal looks forward to using a laparoscopic set given in her memory.

The laparoscopic set currently in use is an old one, is not complete, and has to be used from the surgery department. Demand for gynecological laparoscopic surgery is high, and a new, complete set will be of great benefit to the OB/GYN department, where 1200 -1500 babies are currently delivered each year. With the aid of the new set, Dr. Goyal foresees being better able to meet the demand for quality patient care.

Our thanks go out to those who have already contributed to the new set, and to those who will help in the future as we continue to work towards the goal of its purchase.

Ludhiana CMC US Board Started by

Pioneering Gynecologist

Nine persons were in attendance at that first meeting of what has became known as the Ludhiana Christian Medical College Board USA, Inc. and Dr. Howard A. Kelly of Baltimore was elected president. Dr. Howard Atwood Kelly was the pioneer-



ing American gynecologist credited with establishing gynecology as a true specialty. He was one of the "Big Four" founding professors of Johns Hopkins Hospital, and was first professor of gynecology and obstetrics at Johns Hopkins University and gynecological surgeon at Johns Hopkins Hospital. During his 30 years at Johns Hopkins, he invented a number of medical devices, including an air cystoscope, the widely used Kelly clamp, the

Kelly speculum, and innovative pads for drainage from the operating table. He created new surgical approaches to women's diseases, such as what became known as Kelly's stitch, and defined what became known as Kelly's sign. He also pioneered in the use of radium to treat cancer. During the final quarter of his life, Dr. Kelly devoted himself to his private clinic and his many public and religious interests, among which was Ludhiana CMC. Those present at the Ludhiana CMC US Board May 2011 meeting were reminded once again of the giant footsteps of those who have gone before in the work and mission of Ludhiana CMC.

Dr. Abraham Thomas Receives International Recognition



The Ludhiana Christian Medical College and its Director, Dr. Thomas, have just been recognized by the American College of Surgeons as achieving one of 5 worldwide milestones in the advancement of surgery during the decade of the 90's.

The recognition cites: "Abraham Thomas, MD, a plastic surgeon, conducted the first full-face replant operation on a nine-year-old Sandeep Kaur, whose face and

scalp were pulled off when her hair was caught in a thresher. Sandeep was brought to the Christian Medical College and Hospital in Ludhiana, India, where Dr. Thomas, an experienced microsurgeon, spent 10 hours sewing on Sandeep's face and scalp. The operation was successful, although she was left with some muscle damage as well as scarring around the perimeter where the facial skin was sutured back on."

Nurse Sandeep currently serves as a registered staff nurse on Ward 5 of the Ludhiana Christian Medical College. She continues to benefit from Dr. Thomas' expertise, having undergone several plastic surgeries since. The most recent was just last month.
