A New Memorial Fund



In memory of his wife and their mother, Dr. Daniel Mathews and his three daughters have opened an investment fund with the CMC US Board by making an initial memorial donation of \$100,000. The family will decide how the money is used to benefit the Ludhiana Christian Medical College. Dr. Mathews returned to CMC in March after 50 years. Two of his daughters, who had never been to CMC, accompanied him. They took a campus tour and met with Director Dr. Thomas about needs of CMC. The new fund was dedicated and a memorial certificate prepared by the US CMC Board was presented to them by Dr. Thomas. The memorial certificate reads: "In loving memory of Dr. Raj Mathews, we give thanks for her heart of service shown to her family, students, patients and humanity. With grateful hearts we dedicate to the Glory of Almighty God the establishment of the Dr. Daniel and Dr. Raj Mathews Fund with the initial gift of \$100,000 from her family for the Ludhiana Christian Medical College."
