The Class of 1968 decided that the best way to celebrate their 50th year reunion was to give back to their alma mater by giving a gift that will keep on giving. Class members donated \$74,413 to transform an old building on campus to a "Sarai", a place for the families of poor patients to lodge. They raised funds for the renovation and for an endowment fund for staffing, upkeep and maintenance.

Endowment Funds Increase and Grow—From 800,000 in 2012 to 2.2 Million Today

Endowment funds are like the Energizer Bunny. They are gifts that keep on giving. The first one was established in 1999 by Drs. S.A and Helga Nallathambi. In 2013 the Cherry Mathews Endowment Fund was established for a Chair in Neurology. Also in 2013, after Dr. Raj Mathews passed away, her family established the Drs. Daniel and Raj Mathews Investment Fund in her memory. In 2014 the Drs. Harish and Parveen Anand Investment Fund was established and continues to grow. In 2015 the Drs. Gurpal S. Bhuller & Neena G. Singh Endowment Fund was established and has continued to receive funds for the Ophthalmology Department. After Rev. Dr. David Simon lost his wife, Mabreen, to cancer, his family opened the Mabreen Simon Endowment Fund for Cancer Research. The Mary Lou Duerksen Memorial Scholarship Fund was also established that same year. This past year the Drs. Jacob & Mary Danial Scholarship Endowment Fund was opened. Drs. Joy and Elizabeth Paul opened an investment fund for the purchase of a lithotripsy machine for the Urology Department. In 2017 Dr. Anand and Asha Panwalker established an endowment fund for student scholarships and board projects. Also in 2017 the Eggleston Trust Endowment Fund was established through alumni donations. And most recently an endowment fund was established through an estate gift from Dr. Bhagwant Gill. In the past six years the investment funds of the CMC US Board have grown from \$773,811 to over \$2.2 million. Endowment funds for the Ludhiana Christian Medical College may be established with a tax deductible donation of \$50,000 or more. The investment funds are kept in the United States with earnings from the funds sent to CMC.

Forrest Eggleston Lectureship Trust

Under the leadership of Dr. Sarjit Gill, Trust President, the Forrest Eggleston Lectureship Trust has been established. Dr. Navneet Chaudhry has provided leadership in Ludhiana to recruit local trustees for India. Initially Dr. Gill set a goal of raising \$50,000 for the trust from US alumni. This goal was met and then exceeded. Lately the trust has received an additional \$50,000 from the Eggleston Estate. The income from the Trust each year will fund a high quality medical lecture on the campus for students, faculty and the Ludhiana medical community.

The Inaugural Lecture for the Eggleston Trust will be held at the Ludhiana Christian Medical College on March 23, 2019. The oration will be delivered by Dr. C. Palanivelu, Founder of the Association of Minimally Invasive Surgeons of India (AMASI). He is a world-renowned laparoscopic surgeon.

Dr. Eggleston was a beloved professor at CMC for 32 years. He started the Department of Surgery and also served as Director for several years.
